CHAPTER III RESEARCH METHOD

Within this chapter, the researcher addresses five topics. First, delve into the design of previous research. Second, the research setting, object, and subject. Third, the research instrument. The next section data analysis. Lastly, the chapter explores the technique employed for data analysis

A. Research Design

Qualitative study is research design which to observe natural object where researcher is the key instrument. Dornyei et al., (2008) says that qualitative research involves data collection procedures that result primarily in open-ended, non-numerical data which is then analysed primarily by non-statistical methods. Typical examples of this research are interview research, with the transcribed recordings analysed by qualitative content analysis.

As a result, the researcher employs a research strategy that yields a description of the words, which deals with qualitative study. This qualitative study is used to analyse personification in Mitksi's selected song from her album "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We". In this research, the qualitative research is the appropriate method for producing a decent analytical result in order to locate the figurative language for this study because qualitative research embraces subjectivity and acknowledges the importance of individual interpretations. It allows researcher to explore diverse viewpoints, understand the lived experiences of songwriters and listeners, and delve into the personal meaning attributed to lyrics.

B. Research Setting, Subject, and Object

1. Setting

This research used an online platform setting, namely Spotify. Spotify is supported on various devices such as iOS 14, Android OS 5.0, Mac OS X 10.15, and Windows 10. Through Spotify, researcher can listen to songs while reading the lyrics. Scholarly investigations typically leverage a freely accessible digital platform known as Genius: Song Lyrics & Knowledge, which is readily available across a range of technological devices.

2. Subject

The subject of the research is the eleven songs in "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We" album by Mitski.

3. Object

The object of this research was related to the use of personification_language that was applied in Mitski's song lyrics, the type of personification that used in Mitski's song lyrics, and the meaning of personification that used in Mitski "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We" album. The songs with the code are: Bug Like an Angel (BLA), Buffalo Replaced (BFR), Heaven (HVN), I Don't Like My Mind (IDLM), The Deal (TD), When Memories Snow (WMS), My Love Mine All Mine (MLM), The Frost (TFR), Star (STR), I'm Your Man (IYM), and I Love Me After You (ILM). Analyzing the aesthetic growth and thematic coherence in Mitski's most recent body of work. This imaginary album's songs span a wide spectrum of emotional terrain, from the more anthemic and emphatic "I'm Your Man" to the reflective and vulnerable "I Don't Like My Mind." A thorough examination of the narrative arcs, musical genres, and lyrical content included in these 11 works would shed light on Mitski's creative development and the broad conceptual framework that her most recent album explores.

C. Research Instrument

According to Sugiyono, (2014), a research instrument is a tool used to measure observed natural and social phenomena. A research instrument is a tool used to carry out research activities, especially as a measurement and data collection in the form of a questionnaire, a set of test questions, and observation sheet, and so on.

Since one of the goals of the instrument is to help this research, the primary instrument in this qualitative study is utilized to collect the data. According to this study, the instruments used in this research are song lyrics from Mitski's "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We" album through the premium Spotify application, the media using cell phone, laptop, and headphone.

1. "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We" Album

The seventh studio album by American singer-songwriter Mitski, titled The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We, was made available through Dead Oceans on September 15, 2023. It was recorded at Sunset Sound in Los Angeles and the

Bomb Shelter studio in Nashville under the production of Patrick Hyland. The songs "Bug Like an Angel," "Star" / "Heaven," and "My Love Mine All Mine," the latter of which is among Mitski's most popular to date, were released as singles to support the album from July to October 2023. Reviews for The Land Is Inhospitable were overwhelmingly positive, with reviewers praising both the music's minimalist approach and Mitski's lyrics' emotional honesty.

The major source for this study would be Mitski's "The Land Is Inhospitable and So Are We" album, outside from that. Following are the steps for gathering data for this study:




Figure 2. Diagram Data Collecting Procedure

Write the personification in the tabulation instrument.
